Celebrating Lab School's 50th Anniversary

Fifty years. Five decades. Half a century.

On Friday, September 30, at the dedication of the new High School, The Lab School of Washington officially kicked off its yearlong 50th anniversary celebration.

The Lab School of Washington has been transforming the lives of students in grades 1-12 with dyslexia, ADHD, and other learning differences (LD). It uses an innovative, arts-based curriculum and non-traditional approach to rigorous, college-preparatory academics and strategic problem-solving. Lab has two campuses in the Palisades/Foxhall area: Elementary at 1550 Foxhall Road NW (since 2007), and Intermediate, Junior High, and High School at 4759 Reservoir Road NW (since 1983). Its students live in the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia, but its reputation as a top school for LD education is world-wide.

Lab is marking the year with several events and projects including a kick-off party in the new High School; a special 50th Anniversary Lecture Series dedicated to innovative educational issues (which is free and open to the public; please come!); a special anniversary issue of Lab's LINK magazine; Throwback Thursday posts and archival photos on social media; an old-fashioned, school-wide birthday party with costumes and cake; and the culminating celebration at the 2017 Annual Awards Gala. In addition, Lab is focusing on its commitment towards making a Lab School education more accessible to families in need of financial assistance.

Another Foxhall Village Gas Leak

A powerful gas leak that erupted from a Foxhall Village street on Tuesday night (February 28, 2017) was followed by a day of repairs. And then on Thursday, DC Water workers showed up at the site, saying they were there to fix a sewer pipe.

What caused the leak in the Washington Gas line and what's been done to avoid a recurrence remains unclear. Exactly what time the gas leak started isn't clear, but it was sometime Tuesday night. The hiss and sulfurous scent of mercaptan filled the air at the south end of 44th Street.

The sensory commotion came from under steel plates covering a pipe trench just north of P Street, where gas line work has been occurring off and on for months.

DPW Offers Options to Dispose of HHW/E-cycling/Personal Documents for Shredding in April

The Department of Public Works (DPW) will accept District residents' household hazardous waste and e-cyclables Thursday, March 30, 1 pm-5 pm and on Saturday, April 1, 8 am-3 pm, at the Ft. Totten Transfer Station, 4900 John F. McCormack Drive, NE.* DPW also will provide document shredding services for up to five boxes (or equivalent container) of documents, such as bank statements, credit cards, and pay stubs for shredding from each resident. The boxes should be no larger than 16.5"x12.5"x 8.5" or the approximate size of a box of copy paper. Document shredding is available the first Saturday of the month only. Check www.dpw.dc.gov for 2017 drop-off, document shredding schedules.

District residents may drop off HHW items such as pesticides, batteries and cleaning fluids at Ft. Totten, along with e-cycling items such as computers, televisions and other unwanted electronic equipment every Saturday (except holidays). For a list of all household hazardous waste and e-cyclables accepted by DPW, including how to prepare lithium batteries or batteries greater than 9 volts, and additional information about document shredding, please click on the HHW link at www.dpw.dc.gov.

*Directions to Ft. Totten, 4900 John F. McCormack Drive, NE: Travel east on Irving Street, NW, turn left on Michigan Avenue, turn left on John F. McCormack Drive, NE and continue to the end of the street. Directions from additional locations can be found at www.dpw.dc.gov.


Lab School Anniversary Cont.
