



## FCCA Membership is United in Opposition to GU's 10-Year Plan, and especially the Loop Road—We'll meet in June for Pre-Hearing Strategy

It was clear at the extraordinarily well-attended, March FCCA General Meeting—with City Council Member Mary Cheh—that the community is united in opposition to GU's plan and we, as a community, are preparing to do all within our power to have an impact on it. That meeting was postponed from February due to Ms. Cheh's schedule. So far, GU does not appear interested in compromising on the Loop Road, though influential Mary Cheh has gone on record as opposing it and stated that she would testify against it at the coming hearings.

We now have Ms. Cheh on board and she sees how important this issue is to us. The FCCA has applied for “party status” so we can participate in the hearings, but the hearings at which we will be heard are still some months off, so the Board decided to give everyone a “meeting breather” until June, when we will ramp up efforts in advance of the Hearings.

## Demolition on Riverside Hospital Site Underway and “Canal Parc” Construction to Follow

The Zoning Commission approved the Canal Parc project in 2009 over neighborhood objections. Notes ANC Commissioner Ann Haas, “I am still having trouble envisioning two rows of eight townhouses on lots smaller than 700 square feet separated by a 20-foot wide alley that will serve as back yards for all of the four-story buildings.”

Canal Parc is a PUD of 34 rowhouses on the three acre MacArthur Blvd.. Three types of rowhouses will range in height from 35 feet to 49 feet. Private roads will access them and parking will be in garages under each house. The proposal also includes several quite small, landscaped parks, hence the name. Not sure about the logic of the spelling, however. Maybe *parcs* are smaller than *parks*? ## Watch for Construction to Begin on St. Patrick's Brady Estate Foxhall Road Site

St. Patrick's will begin construction of their new playing field on their Foxhall Road property in late April 2011. The project is expected to be completed within one year. The focus on the construction is a new regulation-size artificial turf field. The project will also include the construction of a new entrance drive with on-site parking. As part of the project, the Day School will build new acceleration and deceleration lanes and a new traffic light at the entrance to the property (between Whitehaven Pkwy and Hoban Road) on Foxhall Road.

## March 16 FCCA General Meeting with DC Ward 3 Council Member Mary Cheh Results in Unanimous Vote to file for Party Status and Oppose GU's 10-Year Plan in City GU Plan Hearings

After the police report, FCCA President Bob Avery spoke about the desirability of empowering the FCCA Board to represent the membership as a "Party in Opposition" to the Georgetown University expansion plan. The members present voted unanimously to this proposal. By doing so, the FCCA joined the citizens groups in Burleith and Georgetown, as well as members of Advisory Neighborhood Commission 3D, in their opposition to the plan.


Ms. Mary Cheh, Ward 3 Councilwoman, addressed the group. She spoke briefly about the April 1<sup>st</sup> budget that is to be presented by Mayor Gray. She expressed concerns that the deficit has exhausted reserve funds for the last four years and that the District faces some stark financial realities.

Ms. Cheh reported that she recently met with two GU officials and toured the campus. She saw the proposed "Loop Road" site for shuttle buses and suggested, in writing, an alternative to the road that would not impact the Glover Archbold Park and the surrounding neighborhood. This would be a "turn around" near the Lombardi Cancer Center entrance. Ms. Cheh stated in her letter that the proposed loop road was unnecessary and would create harm. She also discussed a "cap" to student enrollment with the GU officials. She stated that to date she has not received a response from GU relative to her suggestions. Ms. Cheh stated that she would testify at the meeting of the Zoning Commission in opposition to the GU expansion plan.

Ms. Cheh entertained questions from the group. Resident and FCCA Board member, Paul DonVito, expressed concern that GU is framing the issue as one of "community vs. students". He felt that this was unfair, and that the disagreement is with the university that accepts students and then leaves them on their own to find housing in the surrounding neighborhoods, as there is insufficient on-campus housing. Other audience members expressed concern that the proposed graduate student enrollment increase would exacerbate an already tight on-street parking situation in Foxhall Village.

Ms. Cheh stated that she is investigating the possibility of withholding access in the future by universities to DC revenue bonds, as well as the possibility of arranging for the city to receive payments in lieu of taxes from the tax exempt universities. Before adjourning the meeting, Bob Avery informed the group that construction at the Riverside Hospital site is scheduled to begin this summer. Also, St. Patrick's School will commence building on the site of the former Casey mansion in the near future.



## GU Fined for Failing to File Erosion and Sediment Control Plan

There was a ricochet from the December 2009 landslide along Georgetown University's property that borders Glover-Archbold Park. It nicked GU's wallet.

GU was cited by the D.C. Department of the Environment for failing to provide an "erosion and sediment control plan" and paid a \$30,000 fine on Feb. 8, 2011, according to agency records. GU admitted it failed to file the plan and blamed "internal miscommunication."

"We have implemented corrective administrative actions to improve communications and processes," the university stated. The required plan has been filed, according to agency officials.

The D.C. agency inspected the site April 29, 2010, calling for "corrective action" that included installing fencing and runoff control measures, as well as the required erosion control plan. The actions were required by May 3, 2010, according to the "Notice of Violation."

At the end of March 2011, erosion control fencing was still in place along the steep slope where the landslide that spread into the park occurred.

It is along the top of the slope that borders the national park where GU plans to build a thoroughfare for its commuter buses that would connect the university's entrance on Canal Road with Reservoir Road. The commuter bus route is part of GU's 2010-2020 Campus Plan, which was filed Dec. 30, 2010 with the D.C. Zoning Commission for review and action. A commission public hearing on the plan is expected soon.

## DDOT Mailing New Visitor Parking Passes

The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) has began mailing a new 2011 visitor parking pass to eliminate the inconvenience of having to obtain a visitor parking permit from the Metropolitan Police Department each time a guest is expected.

The 2011 passes are red and white and one pass per household will be mailed to District residents.

The permits will be valid for one year and will allow visitors to park for more than two hours on any RPP block within the boundaries of the resident's Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC).

### Conditions for Use of the Visitor Parking Pass:

- Visitors should display the Visitor Parking Pass on the driver's side of the dashboard. At the end of the visit, visitors should return the VPP to the resident.
- A VPP is not to be used as a substitute for a valid RPP sticker on a vehicle owned by a resident of the household.
- **VPP does not provide an exemption from the Registration of Out-of-State Automobiles (ROSA) requirement to register a vehicle in the District of Columbia within 30 days of residency.**
- Vehicles displaying an invalid pass are subject to a parking citation.
- Duplication or sale of the pass is strictly prohibited and violators are subject to a \$300 fine.

## Let's Get Serious About Crime

During the last two months there have been 43 crimes in our Police Patrol area (PSA 205). PSA205 covers an area that includes Foxhall, Palisades, Kent, Berkeley, Spring Valley, and the American University. Of the 43 crimes committed, 15 occurred in our neighborhood. October had a reduction to 16 crimes in PSA 205, and 3 within our neighborhood.

The most prevalent crimes are burglary, theft, and theft from auto. For the most part these crimes are preventable. As a neighborhood, we need to make this a risky area for thieves/criminals to operate and to make it as non-profitable as possible. We can accomplish this by reporting any suspicious activity by calling 911, locking your front and back doors, and removing valuables or perceived valuables from your car. More than half of the burglaries occurred with the home doors unlocked.

### Neighborhood Crime (last 60 days):

**Assault with a deadly weapon (not gun)(1): Q and MacArthur**  
**Burglaries (5):** 4400 blocks of Greenwich, Reservoir, and P, and on Salem Ln, and 47th Pl.  
**Theft (2):** Kenmore, 45th St  
**Theft from auto (6):** Greenwich Pkwy (2), MacArthur Blvd (2), Salem Ln (2)  
**Stolen Auto (1):** Greenwich  
 If you look at this closely, you notice four crimes on Greenwich, 3 on Salem Ln, and 3 at MacArthur and Q.

## Planning Exterior Projects? Do You Have a Permit?

As a reminder, DC building permits are required for many common renovation projects.

Below is a partial list of exterior work that requires a permit whether or not you live in the Foxhall Village Historic District, whether you are renovating the front of your home or the back:

- Additions
- Decks, new or replacement
- Dormers, new or replacement
- Exterior lighting, new
- Fences, new or replacement
- HVAC equipment, new or replacement
- Paving (including steps), new or replacement
- Retaining walls, new or replacement
- Roof, replacement

### Additional permits required for the Historic District only:

- Front doors, new or replacement
- Windows, new or replacement
- Window openings, new or expanded (only allowable in the rear of homes in historic district)
